TASTING NOTES

- **Appearance:** Deep amber, bright, with golden highlights.
- **Nose:** Highly complex and intense, with aromas of acacia honey, dried apricots, candied orange peel, black tea, and delicate spices, supported by an elegant mineral background.
- **Palate:** Rich and enveloping, with sweetness perfectly balanced by vibrant acidity that provides freshness and lift. Silky in texture, it delivers an elegant palate and a very long finish, with notes of toasted nuts, caramel, and subtle balsamic nuances.



ELABORATION

Each year, we save limited batches of Muscat from our Chivite Vendimia Tardía, sourced from the historic El Candelero vineyard.

The harvest of our Vendimia Tardía is carried out manually in small 15 kg boxes, with several passes through the vineyard to guarantee that each cluster is picked at its optimal ripeness.

The most is left to settle for two days before fermenting in french oak barrels. Fermentation stops naturally at the point where the desired balance between sugar, acidity, and the alcoholic grade is achieved. This is followed by a prolonged batonnage that is prolonged for at least one year, which adds volumen and complexity.

Once we obtain our great Chivite Vendimia Tardía wine, and only once a vintage of exceptional quality is recognized, we proceed with a limited barrel selection to continue with a longer and more gradual aging. This gives rise to these longaging wines, where time reveals all the nobility of this Moscatel Viejísimo de Saca.

VINEYARDS AND SOILS

The grapes come from the El Candelero vineyard, owned by the winery, planted in 1969. Located at 393 meters above sea level in the Ribera Baja subzone, this bush-trained vineyard is characterized by its ancient clay and gravel soils, which provides excellent drainage.
